

Law Enforcement Occupations Labor Market Information Report Chabot College

Prepared by the San Francisco Bay Center of Excellence for Labor Market Research

Recommendation

Based on all available data, there appears to be an "undersupply" of Law Enforcement workers compared to the demand for this cluster of occupations in the Bay region and in the East Bay sub-region (Alameda and Contra Costa counties). There is a projected annual gap of about 477 students in the Bay region and 153 students in the East Bay Sub-Region.

Introduction

This report provides student outcomes data on employment and earnings for TOP 2105.00 - Administration of Justice programs in the state and region. It is recommended that these data be reviewed to better understand how outcomes for students taking courses on this TOP code compare to potentially similar programs at colleges in the state and region, as well as to outcomes across all CTE programs at Chabot College and in the region.

This report profiles Law Enforcement Occupations in the 12 county Bay region and in the East Bay sub-region for a proposed new program at Chabot College.

 Probation Officers and Correctional Treatment Specialists (21-1092): Provide social services to assist in rehabilitation of law offenders in custody or on probation or parole. Make recommendations for actions involving formulation of rehabilitation plan and treatment of offender, including conditional release and education and employment stipulations.

Entry-Level Educational Requirement: Bachelor's degree

Training Requirement: Short-term on-the-job training

Percentage of Community College Award Holders or Some Postsecondary Coursework: $12\,\%$

• First-Line Supervisors of Police and Detectives (33-1012): Directly supervise and coordinate activities of members of police force.

Entry-Level Educational Requirement: High school diploma or equivalent

Training Requirement: Moderate-term on-the-job training

Percentage of Community College Award Holders or Some Postsecondary Coursework: $42\ \%$

Correctional Officers and Jailers (33-3012): Guard inmates in penal or rehabilitative institutions in accordance
with established regulations and procedures. May guard prisoners in transit between jail, courtroom, prison, or
other point. Includes deputy sheriffs and police who spend the majority of their time guarding prisoners in
correctional institutions.

Entry-Level Educational Requirement: High school diploma or equivalent

Training Requirement: Moderate-term on-the-job training

Percentage of Community College Award Holders or Some Postsecondary Coursework: 49 %

 Detectives and Criminal Investigators (33-3021): Conduct investigations related to suspected violations of Federal, State, or local laws to prevent or solve crimes. Excludes "Private Detectives and Investigators" (33-9021).

Entry-Level Educational Requirement: High school diploma or equivalent

Training Requirement: Moderate-term on-the-job training

Percentage of Community College Award Holders or Some Postsecondary Coursework: $32\ \%$

Police and Sheriffs Patrol Officers (33-3051): Maintain order and protect life and property by enforcing local, tribal, State, or Federal laws and ordinances. Perform a combination of the following duties: patrol a specific area; direct traffic; issue traffic summonses; investigate accidents; apprehend and arrest suspects, or serve legal processes of courts.

Entry-Level Educational Requirement: High school diploma or equivalent

Training Requirement: Moderate-term on-the-job training

Educational Supply

There are 23 community colleges in the Bay Region issuing 1,817 awards on average annually (last 3 years ending 2018-19) on TOP 2105.00 - Administration of Justice. In the East Bay Sub-Region, there are seven (7) community colleges that issued 369 awards on average annually (last 3 years) on this TOP code.

There are a three (3) other CTE educational institutions in the Bay Region issuing 14 awards on average annually (last 3 years ending 2016-17) on TOP 2105.00 - Administration of Justice. There are two (2) other CTE educational institutions in the East Bay Sub-Region issuing 8 awards on average annually (last 3 years) on this TOP code.

Gap Analysis

Based on the data included in this report, there is a labor market gap in the Bay region with 2,308 annual openings for the Law Enforcement occupational cluster and 1,831 annual (3-year average) awards for an annual undersupply of 477 students. In the East Bay Sub-Region, there is also a gap with 530 annual openings and 377 annual (3-year average) awards for an annual undersupply of 153 students.
