

## Regional Employment and Jobs Update






This month's employment and jobs data were collected the week of July 12th, after the Governor's <u>Stay</u>

<u>Home Order and Blueprint for a Safer Economy</u> executive orders were terminated on June 15th.

## Civilian Employment

Civilian employment measures the number of residents in the region working or actively seeking work. In July 2021, the number of employed residents increased by 15,600, and the unemployed fell by 900. The unemployment rate decreased slightly to 7.9% in July 2021, down from a revised 8% in June 2021, but more than doubled from the February 2020 unemployment rate at 3.9%; widely considered the last month of employment unaffected by the COVID-19 pandemic.






## Jobs

Industry employment counts jobs by the place of work. In July 2021, nonfarm employers reported a net loss of 13,400 jobs (down 0.9%) for a total of 1,517,800 jobs in the region. Farm employers reported a loss of 2,700 jobs over the month (down 15.7%).

The region added 79,500 nonfarm jobs over the year (July 2020 to July 2021), up 5.5%, but reported 69,300 fewer jobs since February 2020, down 4.4%. Figure 2 displays month-over nonfarm job change from February 2020, generally considered the last month employment was not impacted by the pandemic, to July 2021.



The following major industry sectors reported notable month-over job changes:

• The **government** sector reported a month-over loss of 13,900 jobs in July, down 5.8%. Most of the jobs lost in this sector resulted from seasonal cuts in the local government education subsector (down 12,600 jobs) and the state government education subsector (down 1,500). City governments reported 300 job cuts. County governments added 400 jobs over the month. The government sector is down 14.4% from its February 2020 employment level.



- Construction sector employers cut 2,600 jobs over the month, down 2.4%. Specialty trade
  contractors, employers performing specific activities but are not responsible for the entire project
  (e.g., pouring concrete, site preparation, plumbing, painting, and electrical work) reported all the
  month-over job losses in this sector, down 2,600 jobs.
- **Educational services**, mostly privately owned and operated for profit or not for profit educational institutions, employment fell by 3.9%, down 700 jobs. The educational services sector is down 20.5% from its February 2020 employment level.
- The accommodations & food services sector added 1,500 jobs over the month, boosting employment by 1.1%. The food services & drinking places subsector added 1,200 jobs; full-service restaurants increased by 700 jobs, and limited-service eating places increased by 500. The accommodations & food services sector is down 12.5% from its February 2020 employment level.
- Transportation & warehousing employers added 1,300 jobs to the region, up 0.7%. The
  warehousing & storage subsector boosted employment in this sector, adding 600 jobs over the
  month. The transportation & warehousing sector has increased overall employment by 20.1% from
  its February 2020 employment level.
- The **wholesale trade sector** added 1,300 jobs, increasing employment by 2% in July. Most of the gains reported in this sector were in the merchant wholesalers, durable goods subsector (up 1,000 jobs or 2.7%).

Figure 3 displays month-over, year-over, and since February 2020 jobs changes for all major industry sectors in the Inland Empire/Desert region.
