

Real Estate Occupations Labor Market Information Report Contra Costa College

Prepared by the San Francisco Bay Center of Excellence for Labor Market Research November 2020

Recommendation

Based on all available data, there appears to be an undersupply of Real Estate workers compared to the demand for this cluster of occupations in the Bay region and in the East Bay sub-region (Alameda and Contra Costa Counties). There is a projected annual gap of about 3,013 students in the Bay region and 814 students in the East Bay Sub-Region.

Introduction

This report provides student outcomes data on employment and earnings for TOP 0511.00-Real Estate programs in the state and region. It is recommended that these data be reviewed to better understand how outcomes for students taking courses on this TOP code compare to potentially similar programs at colleges in the state and region, as well as to outcomes across all CTE programs at Contra Costa College and in the region.

This report profiles Real Estate Occupations in the 12 county Bay region and in the East Bay sub-region for a College/District program review at Contra Costa College.

• Real Estate Sales Agents (41-9022): Rent, buy, or sell property for clients. Perform duties, such as study property listings, interview prospective clients, acCo clients to property site, discuss conditions of sale, and draw up real estate contracts. Includes agents who represent buyer.

Entry-Level Educational Requirement: High school diploma or equivalent

Training Requirement: Moderate-term on-the-job training

Real Estate Brokers (41-9021): Operate real estate office, or work for commercial real estate firm, overseeing
real estate transactions. Other duties usually include selling real estate or renting properties and arranging
loans

There are 10 community colleges in the Bay Region issuing 142 awards on average annually (last 3 years ending 2018-19) on TOP 0511.00-Real Estate. There are four (4) colleges in the East Bay Sub-Region issuing 45 awards on average annually (last 3 years) on this TOP code.

Gap Analysis

Based on the data included in this report, there is a large labor market gap in the Bay region with 3,155 annual openings for the Real Estate occupational cluster and 142 annual (3-year average) awards for an annual undersupply of 3,013 students. In the East Bay Sub-Region, there is also a gap with 859 annual openings and 45 annual (3-year average) awards for an annual undersupply of 814 students.

Labor demand data is sourced from Economic Modeling Specialists International (EMSI) occupation data and Burning Glass job postings data. Educational supply and student outcomes data is retrieved from multiple sources, including CTE Launchboard and CCCCO Data Mart.
