



Labor Market Analysis for Program Recommendation Policing Occupations Las Positas College

Prepared by the San Francisco Bay Center of Excellence for Labor Market Research
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Recommendation

Based on the data included in this report, there may be an oversupply in the Bay region labor market of Policing workers with 1,569 annual openings for Police and Sheriffs Patrol Officers and 1,831 annual (3-year average) awards for a potential annual oversupply of 262 students.

However, if the majority of the 587 non-credit awards - which are likely for "in-service" training or "professional development" training for current officers in the Santa Rosa Police Department, Sonoma County Sheriff's Office and other local law enforcement agencies - are subtracted from the supply number, (since these awards do not represent new graduates looking for a job, but current workers) then there would be an undersupply in the region of 325 students.

In the East Bay Sub-Region (Alameda and Contra Costa counties), there appears to be a balance between demand and supply, with 381 annual openings and 377 annual (3-year average) awards for a slight undersupply of four (4) students.

Introduction

This report provides student outcomes data on employment and earnings for TOP 2105.00 Administration of Justice programs in the state and region. It is recommended that these data be reviewed to better understand how outcomes for students taking courses on this TOP code compare to potentially similar programs at colleges in the state and region, as well as to outcomes across all CTE programs at Las Positas College and in the region.

This report profiles Policing Occupations in the 12 county Bay region and in the East Bay sub-region for a proposed new 21st Century Policing program at Las Positas College.

- **Police and Sheriffs Patrol Officers (33-3051):** Maintain order and protect life and property by enforcing local, tribal, State, or Federal laws and ordinances. Perform a combination of the following duties: patrol a specific area; direct traffic; issue traffic summonses; investigate accidents; apprehend and arrest suspects, or serve legal processes of courts.
 - Entry-Level Educational Requirement: High school diploma or equivalent
 - Training Requirement: Moderate-term on-the-job training
 - Percentage of Community College Award Holders or Some Postsecondary Coursework: 49%

Educational Supply

There are twenty-three (23) community colleges in the Bay Region issuing 1,817 awards on average annually (last 3 years ending 2018-19) on TOP 2105.00 Administration of Justice. In the East Bay Sub-Region, there is a seven (7) community colleges that issued 369 awards on average annually (last 3 years) on this TOP code.

There are three (3) other CTE educational institutions in the Bay Region issuing 14 awards on average annually (last 3 years ending 2016-17) on TOP 2105.00 Administration of Justice. There are two (2) other CTE educational institutions in the East Bay Sub-Region issuing 8 awards on average annually (last 3 years) on this TOP code.

Gap Analysis

Based on the data included in this report, at first glance there appears to be an oversupply in the Bay region labor market for Policing workers with 1,569 annual openings for Police and Sheriffs Patrol Officers and 1,831 annual (3-year average) awards on TOP 2105.00 (Administration of Justice) for a potential annual oversupply of 262 students.
