# High-Quality Occupations Profile:

Northern Los Angeles County



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## • Executive Summary

This Northern Los Angeles County High-Quality Occupations Profile provides key findings from the SCC COE's analysis of the county's labor market, which emphasizes not only the number of jobs, projected growth, and demand, but also the quality of employment opportunities across occupational sectors. This report supports regional community colleges and workforce partners in aligning educational programs with the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office Vision 2030 goals and the economic realities of the South Central Coast (SCC) Region.

To address regional challenges related to the rising cost of living, an aging population, and the high concentration of lower-wage jobs, this analysis classifies 740 Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) occupations into High-, Medium-, and Low-Quality categories using nine criteria, blending traditional labor market indicators with measures of job quality such as wages, benefits, and automation risk. Of the 740 occupations: 148 (20%) are High Quality, 375 (52%) are Medium Quality, and 217 (29%) are Low Quality. The following points highlight key findings related to the 148 High-Quality occupations in Northern Los Angeles County.

- High-Quality occupations are concentrated in the **Health** (37 occupations), **Business and Entrepreneurship** (34), and **Education and Human Development** (17) sectors.
- High-Quality occupations accounted for 29% of total regional employment in 2024 (74,088 jobs).
  - These occupations are projected to grow 3% between 2024 and 2029, slightly outpacing overall employment growth in the region.
  - Notably, employment for **Health** occupations is expected to increase 9%, underscoring the demand for skilled workers in healthcare. In contrast, sectors such as **Education and Human Development** (0.4%) and **Business and Entrepreneurship** (1%) are projected to grow at a slower rate.
- Entry-level wages in nearly all High-Quality occupations exceed both the Self-Sufficiency Standard (\$24.03 per hour) and MIT Living Wage (\$27.81 per hour) thresholds, with **Public Safety** (\$47.03), **ICT/Digital Media** (\$47.00), and **Health** (\$42.45) leading the way.
- Sectors with high rates of employer-sponsored health insurance coverage include **Public Safety** (97%), **Agriculture, Water and Environmental Technologies** (92%), and **Education and Human Development** (90%).
- Automation risk is low across sectors, with **ICT/Digital Media** and **Education and Human Development** having the lowest levels of risk and **Energy, Construction, and Utilities** having the highest.

The findings highlight the importance of targeted investments in education, training, and workforce development that expand access to High-Quality occupations, ensure equitable participation in the labor force, and strengthen the region's long-term economic resilience.
