SUMMARY



The San Diego & Imperial Center of Excellence (COE) developed this brief to determine if an unmet workforce need exists for a baccalaureate degree program (BDP) for Architectural/Interior Design Occupations. According to Assembly Bill No. 927, community college districts seeking approval for a BDP must 1) not offer "program curricula already offered by the California State University or the University of California" systems, 2) "continue to offer an associate degree program in the same academic subject" of the proposed BDP, and 3) "provide evidence of unmet workforce needs." 2

This brief recommends that the San Diego & Imperial Counties Community Colleges to proceed with caution in developing a BDP for Architectural/Interior Design Occupations because similar programs exist in the UC or CSU systems although entry-level and median wages are above the living wage and a supply gap exists for these occupations. The colleges should also note that half of the occupations analyzed in this brief require an associate degree and half require a bachelor's degree.

INTRODUCTION

According to Assembly Bill No. 927, community college districts seeking approval to offer a baccalaureate degree program (BDP) must:³

- 1. Not offer a BDP or "program curricula already offered by the California State University or the University of California"
- "Continue to offer an associate degree program in the same academic subject for which a baccalaureate degree program has been approved"
- 3. Identify and document unmet workforce needs "in the local community or region of the district"

To determine the need for a new BDP, this brief examines labor market information (LMI) for Architectural/Interior Design Occupations using the following Standard Occupational Classification (SOC)⁴ codes:

- Architectural and Civil Drafters (SOC 17-3011): Prepare detailed drawings of architectural and structural features of buildings or drawings and topographical relief maps used in civil engineering projects, such as highways, bridges, and public works. Use knowledge of building materials, engineering practices, and mathematics to complete drawings.
- Architectural and Engineering Managers (SOC 11-9041): Plan, direct, or coordinate activities in such fields as architecture and engineering or research and development in these fields.

- Interior Designers (SOC 27-1025): Plan, design, and furnish the internal space of rooms or buildings. Design interior environments or create physical layouts that are practical, aesthetic, and conducive to the intended purposes. May specialize in a particular field, style, or phase of interior design.
- **Drafters, All Other** (SOC 17-3019) All drafters not listed separately.

According to available LMI, employers require a minimum educational attainment ranging from an associate degree to a bachelor's degree for Architectural/Interior Design Occupations. On average, the entry-level hourly earnings for Architectural/Interior Design Occupations are \$36.37, which is more than the \$18.43 per hour living wage for a single adult in San Diego County.⁵

BDP PROPOSAL REQUIREMENTS

UC and CSU Programs

According to AB-927, community colleges must not offer a BDP or program curricula already offered by the CSU or UC systems. To determine if a BDP already exists for Architectural/Interior Design Occupations, the COE examined CSU and UC programs in related Classification of Instructional Programs (CIP) codes.⁸

According to CIP data, the following institutions from the UC and CSU systems offer programs related to Architectural/Interior Design Occupations (Exhibit 1). Refer to the Appendix at the end of the brief for a list of program titles and award types associated with the related UC and CSU programs.

Existing Associate Degree Program(s)

AB-927 also states that districts should "continue to offer an associate degree program in the same academic subject for which a baccalaureate degree program has been approved." To determine if an associate degree program in the same subject area exists, the COE reviewed the <u>California Community</u> <u>Colleges Chancellor's Office's official TOP-CIP crosswalk</u> and found that there are six TOP codes and 15 CIP codes related to Architectural/Interior Design Occupations (Exhibit 2).

WORKFORCE NEEDS ASSESSMENT: SUPPLY VS. DEMAND

According to AB-927, community colleges must identify and document unmet workforce needs "in the local community or region of the district." To assess the regional workforce need for Architectural/Interior Design Occupations, this section compares educational supply with labor market demand.

Educational Supply

Baccalaureate educational supply for an occupation can be estimated by analyzing the number of completions¹¹ in related CIP codes. According to CIP data, the following institutions supply San Diego County with awards for Architectural/Interior Design Occupations (Exhibit 4). With this, the estimated supply for San Diego County is 103 completions.

Labor Market Demand

Between 2022 and 2027, employers in San Diego County will need to hire 650 workers annually to fill new jobs and backfill jobs due to attrition caused by turnover and retirement for Architectural/Interior Design Occupations (Exhibit 6).

Demand vs. Supply

Comparing labor market demand (annual job openings) with educational supply (bachelor's degree completions) suggests that there is a supply gap for Architectural/Interior Design Occupations in San Diego County, with 650 annual openings and 103 awards. Comparatively, there are 6,174 annual openings in California and 1,888 awards, suggesting that there is also a supply gap across the state ¹² (Exhibit 7).



This data should be used to discuss the potential gaps or oversupply of workers; however, it should not be the only basis for determining whether or not a program should be developed.

OTHER LMI TO CONSIDER FOR PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT

Online Job Postings

This report analyzes not only historical and projected (traditional LMI) data, but also recent data from online job postings (real-time LMI). Online job postings may provide additional insight about recent changes in the labor market that are not captured by historical data. Between 2019 and 2022, there was an average of 2,805 online job postings per year for Architectural/Interior Design Occupations in San Diego County (Exhibit 8). Please note that online job postings do **not** equal labor market demand; demand is represented by annual job openings (see Exhibit 6). While this brief includes online jobs postings data to help with curriculum development, the community colleges should note that this type of data is impacted by several variables: employers may post a position multiple times to increase the pool of applicants; a job posting can remain posted after a business decides not to fill a position; or an employer may use one posting to fill multiple positions, for example.
