

Labor Market Analysis for Program Recommendation Television, Film, and Electronic Media Occupations Cabrillo College

Prepared by Bay Regions Center of Excellence for Labor Market Research

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Recommendation

Based on all available data, there appears to be an "undersupply" of Television, Film, and Electronic Media workers compared to the demand for this cluster of occupations in the Bay region and in the SC-Monterey sub-region (Monterey, San Benito, Santa Cruz counties). There is a projected annual gap of about 1,046 students in the Bay region and 38 students in the SC-Monterey Sub-Region.

Introduction

This report provides student outcomes data on employment and earnings for TOP 0604.20 - Television (including combined TV/Film/Video) programs in the state and region. It is recommended that these data be reviewed to better understand how outcomes for students taking courses on this TOP code compare to potentially similar programs at colleges in the state and region, as well as to outcomes across all CTE programs at Cabrillo College and in the region.

This report profiles Television, Film, and Electronic Media Occupations in the 12 county Bay region and in the SC-Monterey sub-region for a Regional program recommendation at Cabrillo College. Labor market information (LMI) is not available for SOC 25-1122.00 - Communications Teachers, Postsecondary, which was requested by the college. The only available occupation, SOC 25-1099, Postsecondary Teachers, overstates labor market demand for Communications Teachers, Postsecondary, because it includes occupational data for all Postsecondary Teachers in all subject disciplines, and therefore is not included in this report, as it does not align with this program.

Producers and Directors (27-2012): Produce or direct stage, television, radio, video, or motion picture
productions for entertainment, information, or instruction. Responsible for creative decisions, such as
interpretation of script, choice of actors or guests, set design, sound, special effects, and choreography.

Educational Supply

There are fifteen (15) community colleges in the Bay Region issuing 152 awards on average annually (last 3 years ending 2021-23) on TOP 0604.20 - Television (including combined TV/Film/Video). In the SC-Monterey Sub-Region, there are no community colleges that issued awards on average annually (last 3 years) on this TOP code.

There are two (2) four-year institutions in the Bay Region issuing 240 Bachelor's degrees on average annually (last 3 years ending 2020-22) on CIP 09.0701- Radio and Television. But there are no four-year institutions in the SC-Monterey Sub-Region issuing Bachelor's degrees on this CIP code.

Gap Analysis

Based on the data included in this report, there is a labor market gap in the Bay region with 1,449 annual openings for the Television, Film, and Electronic Media occupational cluster and 392 annual (3-year average) awards for an annual undersupply of 1,046 students. In the SC-Monterey Sub-Region, there is also a gap with 38 annual openings and no annual (3-year average) awards for an annual undersupply of 38 students.
