The Los Angeles Center of Excellence for Labor Market Research (LA COE) prepared this report to provide regional labor market supply and demand data related to one middle-skill occupation:

 Diagnostic Medical Sonographers (29-2032) Produce ultrasonic recordings of internal organs for use by physicians. Includes vascular technologists.¹

Middle-skill occupations typically require some postsecondary education, but less than a bachelor's degree.² This report is intended to help determine whether there is demand in the local labor market that is not being met by the supply from community college programs that align with the relevant occupations.

Based on the available data, there does not appear to be a supply gap for diagnostic medical sonographers in the region. While this program does not meet the traditional supply/demand endorsement criteria, there may be demand for these workers from local employers that is not reflected in traditional labor market data. For this reason, real-time labor market data is included in this report as well – to provide a more nuanced view of the regional job market for diagnostic medical sonographers. Furthermore, 548 out of the 583 awards (94%) included in the supply/demand analysis were issued by proprietary institutions. With community colleges only issuing 35 related awards and no current programs at Los Angeles County community colleges, there may be an opportunity to attract a larger portion of prospective students to the community colleges if program offerings are expanded or created. In addition to this occupation's entry-level wage exceeding the self-sufficiency standard wage in both Los Angeles and Orange

counties, workers typically need an associate degree. Therefore, due to some of the criteria being met, the COE endorses this proposed program. Detailed reasons include:

Demand:

- Supply Gap Criteria Over the next five years, 250 jobs are projected to be available annually in the region due to new job growth and replacements, which is less than the three-year average of 583 awards conferred by educational institutions in the region.
 - However, over the past 12 months, there were 1,476 online job postings for diagnostic medical sonographers. The highest number of job postings were for ultrasound technicians, ultrasound technologists, sonographers, vascular ultrasound technicians, and travel OB ultrasound technicians.
- Living Wage Criteria Within Los Angeles County, typical entry-level hourly wages for diagnostic medical sonographers are \$44.37, which is higher than the self-sufficiency standard hourly wage (living wage) for one adult in the region (\$18.10 in Los Angeles County).³
- Educational Criteria The Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) lists an associate degree as the typical entry-level education for diagnostic medical sonographers.
 - Furthermore, the national-level educational attainment data indicates 48% of workers in the field have completed some college or an associate degree.

Supply:

- There are 2 community colleges in the greater LA/OC region that issue awards related to diagnostic medical sonography, conferring an average of 35 awards annually between 2019 and 2022.
- Between 2019 and 2021, there was an average of 548 awards conferred annually in related training programs by non-community college institutions throughout the greater LA/OC region.

Occupational Demand

Exhibit 1 shows the five-year occupational demand projections for diagnostic medical sonographers. In the greater Los Angeles/Orange County region, the number of jobs related to these occupations is projected to increase by 13% through 2026. There will be approximately 250 job openings per year through 2027 due to job growth and replacements.

Wages

The labor market endorsement in this report considers the entry-level hourly wages for diagnostic medical sonographers in Los Angeles County as they relate to the county's self-sufficiency standard wage. Orange County wages are included below in order to provide a complete analysis of the greater LA/OC region. Detailed wage information, by county, is included in Appendix A.

Los Angeles County

The typical entry-level hourly wages for diagnostic medical sonographers are \$44.37, which is <u>above</u> the self-sufficiency standard wage for one adult (\$18.10 in Los Angeles County). Experienced workers can expect to earn wages of \$61.24.

Orange County

The typical entry-level hourly wages for diagnostic medical sonographers are \$45.46, which is <u>above</u> the self-sufficiency standard wage for one adult (\$20.63 in Orange County). Experienced workers can expect to earn wages of \$62.80.



On average, the entry-level earnings for the occupation in this report are \$44.65; this is above the living wage for one single adult in Los Angeles County (\$18.10). Exhibit 4 shows the average wage for the occupation in this report, from entry-level to experienced workers.

Job Postings

There were 1,476 online job postings for diagnostic medical sonographers listed in the past 12 months. The highest number of job postings were for ultrasound technicians, ultrasound technicians, sonographers, vascular ultrasound technicians, and travel OB ultrasound technicians. The top skills were medical ultrasonography, radiology, obstetrics and gynecology, communications systems, and infection control. The top three employers, by number of job postings, in the region were Healthcare Employment Network, RadNet, and Siemens Healthineers.

Educational Attainment

The Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) lists an associate degree as the typical entry-level education for diagnostic medical sonographers. Furthermore, the national-level educational attainment data indicates 48% of workers in the field have completed some college or an associate degree. Of the 18% of diagnostic medical sonographer job postings listing a minimum education requirement in the greater Los Angeles/Orange County region, 51% (135) requested high school or vocational training, 38% (101) requested an associate degree, and 7% (18) requested a bachelor's degree.

Educational Supply

Community College Supply

Exhibit 5 shows the annual and three-year average number of awards conferred by community colleges in the related TOP code: Diagnostic Medical Sonography (1227.00). The only two colleges in the region with completions are Cypress and Orange Coast. There are currently no diagnostic medical sonography programs at Los Angeles County community colleges.

Non-Community College Supply


For a comprehensive regional supply analysis, it is important to consider the supply from other institutions in the region that provide training programs for diagnostic medical sonographers. Exhibit 6 shows the annual and three-year average number of awards conferred by these institutions in relevant programs. Due to different data collection periods, the most recent three-year period of available data is from 2019 to 2021. Between 2019 and 2021, non-community college institutions in the region conferred an average of 548 sub-baccalaureate awards. Sub-baccalaureate awards include associate degrees, postsecondary awards, and other academic awards.

*The average percentage of workers age 55 and older across all occupations in the greater LA/OC region is 27%. This occupation has a smaller share of older workers, which typically indicates fewer replacements needs to offset the amount of impending retirements.
