

Labor Market Analysis for Program Recommendation Mass Media Occupations San Jose City College

Prepared by the Bay Region Center of Excellence for Labor Market Research

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Recommendation

Based on all available data, there appears to be an "undersupply" of Mass Media workers compared to the demand for this cluster of occupations in the Bay Region and in the Silicon Valley Sub-Region (Santa Clara County). There is a projected annual gap of about 533 students in the Bay Region and 54 students in the Silicon Valley Sub-Region.

Introduction

This report provides student outcomes data on employment and earnings for TOP 0604.30 - Broadcast Journalism programs in the state and region. It is recommended that these data be reviewed to better understand how outcomes for students taking courses on this TOP code compare to potentially similar programs at colleges in the state and region, as well as to outcomes across all CTE programs at San Jose City College and in the region.

This report profiles Mass Media Occupations in the 12 county Bay Region and in the Silicon Valley Sub-Region for program recommendation at San Jose City College.

• **Disc Jockeys, Except Radio (27-2091):** Play prerecorded music for live audiences at venues or events such as clubs, parties, or wedding receptions. May use techniques such as mixing, cutting, or sampling to manipulate recordings. May also perform as emcee (master of ceremonies).

Entry-Level Educational Requirement: No formal educational credential

Training Requirement: Short-term on-the-job training

Percentage of Community College Award Holders or Some Postsecondary Coursework: 40%

• **Broadcast Announcers and Radio Disc Jockeys (27-3011):** Speak or read from scripted materials, such as news reports or commercial messages, on radio, television, or other communications media. May play and queue music, announce artist or title of performance, identify station, or interview guests.

Entry-Level Educational Requirement: Bachelor's degree

Training Requirement: None

Percentage of Community College Award Holders or Some Postsecondary Coursework: 33%

News Analysts, Reporters, and Journalists (27-3023): Narrate or write news stories, reviews, or commentary
for print, broadcast, or other communications media such as newspapers, magazines, radio, or television. May
collect and analyze information through interview, investigation, or observation.

Entry-Level Educational Requirement: Bachelor's degree

Training Requirement: None

Percentage of Community College Award Holders or Some Postsecondary Coursework: 10%

Educational Supply

There are no community colleges in the Bay Region issuing awards on average annually (last 3 years ending 2021-23) on TOP 0604.30 - Broadcast Journalism. There are also no other CTE educational institution or four-year institution in the Bay Region issuing awards on average annually (last 3 years ending 2020-22) on CIP 09.4042- Broadcast Journalism.

Gap Analysis

Based on the data included in this report, there is a labor market gap in the Bay Region with 533 annual openings for the Mass Media occupational cluster and no annual (3-year average) awards for an annual undersupply of 533

students. In the Silicon Valley Sub-Region, there is also a gap with 54 annual openings and no annual (3-year average) awards for an annual undersupply of 54 students.
