

Labor Market Analysis for Program Recommendation Business-Personal Finance Occupations Monterey Peninsula College

Prepared by the Bay Region Center of Excellence for Labor Market Research
January 2025

Recommendation

Based on all available data, there appears to be an "undersupply" of Business-Personal Finance workers compared to the demand for this cluster of occupations in the Bay Region and in the SC-Monterey Sub-Region (Monterey, San Benito, Santa Cruz counties). There is a projected annual gap of about 1,066 students in the Bay Region and 25 students in the SC-Monterey Sub-Region.

Introduction

This report provides student outcomes data on employment and earnings for TOP 0504.00 - Banking and Finance programs in the state and region. It is recommended that these data be reviewed to better understand how outcomes for students taking courses on this TOP code compare to potentially similar programs at colleges in the state and region, as well as to outcomes across all CTE programs at Monterey Peninsula College and in the region.

This report profiles Business-Personal Finance Occupations in the 12 county Bay Region and in the SC-Monterey Sub-Region for Program Recommendation at Monterey Peninsula College.

Personal Financial Advisors (13-2052): Advise clients on financial plans using knowledge of tax and
investment strategies, securities, insurance, pension plans, and real estate. Duties include assessing clients'
assets, liabilities, cash flow, insurance coverage, tax status, and financial objectives. May also buy and sell
financial assets for clients.

Typical Entry-Level Educational: Bachelor's degree

Typical On-the-Job Training: Long-term on-the-job training

Percentage of individuals 25+ with an associate degree, certificate, or some postsecondary coursework as their highest level of education attainment: 14%

Credit Counselors (13-2071): Advise and educate individuals or organizations on acquiring and managing
debt. May provide guidance in determining the best type of loan and explain loan requirements or restrictions.
May help develop debt management plans or student financial aid packages. May advise on credit issues, or
provide budget, mortgage, bankruptcy, or student financial aid counseling.

Typical Entry-Level Educational: Bachelor's degree

Typical On-the-Job Training: Moderate-term on-the-job training

Percentage of individuals 25+ with an associate degree, certificate, or some postsecondary coursework as their highest level of education attainment: 33%

Educational Supply

There are three community colleges in the Bay Region issuing 19 awards on average annually (last 3 years ending 2021-23) on TOP 0504.00 - Banking and Finance. In the SC-Monterey Sub-Region, there is zero community colleges that issued awards on average annually (last 3 years) on this TOP code.

Gap Analysis

Based on the data included in this report, there is a labor market gap in the Bay Region with 1,085 annual openings for the Business-Personal Finance occupational cluster and 19 annual (3-year average) awards for an annual undersupply of 1,066 students. In the SC-Monterey Sub-Region, there is also a gap with 25 annual openings and no annual (3-year average) awards for an annual undersupply of 25 students.
