Program Recommendation

This report was compiled by the South Central Coast¹ Center of Excellence to provide regional labor market data for the program recommendation – Technical Theater. This report can help determine whether there is demand in the local labor market that is not being met by the supply from programs of study that align with this occupation group.

Key Findings

- In 2022, there were 1,688 jobs for Technical Theater-related occupations in the South Central Coast Region.
- This number is expected to increase by 2% through 2027.
- Projections show nearly 350 annual openings in the region. An average of 341 awards were conferred in relevant programs, indicating a slight undersupply.
- The Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) lists a high school diploma or equivalent as the typical entry-level education for lighting technicians, and costume attendants; a postsecondary nondegree award for audio and video technicians, sound engineering technicians, and makeup artists, theatrical and performance; some college (no degree) for actors; and a bachelor's degree for fashion designers, editors, and set and exhibit designers.

Occupation Codes and Descriptions

There are nine occupations in the standard occupational classification (SOC) system that were identified as related to Technical Theater for this analysis. The occupation titles and descriptions, as well as reported job titles, are included in Exhibit 1.

Current and Future Employment

In the South Central Coast region, the number of jobs related to Technical Theater occupations are expected to grow 2% through 2027. Nearly 350 openings are expected for these occupations every year through 2027.

Earnings


Exhibit 3 contains hourly wages and annual average earnings for these occupations. Entry-level hourly earnings are represented by the 25^{th} percentile of wages, median hourly earnings are represented by the 50^{th} percentile of wages, and experienced hourly earnings are represented by the 75^{th} percentile of wages, demonstrating various levels of employment.

Employer Job Postings

In this research brief, real-time labor market information is used to provide a more nuanced view of the current job market, as it captures job advertisements for occupations relevant to the field of study. Employer job postings are consulted to understand who is looking for professionals in a given field, and what they are looking for in potential candidates. To identify job postings related to Technical Theater the following standard occupational classifications were used:

Notes

Data included in this analysis represent the labor market demand for relevant positions most closely related to Technical Theater. Traditional labor market information was used to show current and projected employment based on data trends, as well as annual average awards granted by regional community colleges. Real-time labor market information captures job post advertisements for occupations relevant to the field of study and can signal demand and show what employers are looking for in potential employees, but is not a perfect measure of the quantity of open positions. All representations have been produced from primary research and/or secondary review of publicly and/or privately available data and/or research reports. The most recent data available at the time of the analysis was examined; however, data sets are updated regularly and may not be consistent with previous reports.
