

Labor Market Analysis for Program Recommendation Education Pathways Occupations City College of San Francisco

Prepared by the Bay Region Center of Excellence for Labor Market Research

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Recommendation

Based on all available data, there appears to be an "undersupply" of Education Pathways workers compared to the demand for this cluster of occupations in the Bay Region and in the Mid-Peninsula Sub-Region (San Francisco, San Mateo counties). There is a projected annual gap of about 6,809 students in the Bay Region and 1,174 students in the Mid-Peninsula Sub-Region.

Based on the data included in this report, there is a labor market gap in the Bay Region with 6,833 annual openings for the Education Pathways occupational cluster and 24 annual (3-year average) awards for an annual undersupply of 6,809 students. In the Mid-Peninsula Sub-Region, there is also a gap with 1,182 annual openings and 8 annual (3-year average) awards for an annual undersupply of 1,174 students.

Introduction

This report provides student outcomes data on employment and earnings for TOP 1305.50 - The School Age Child programs in the state and region. It is recommended that these data be reviewed to better understand how outcomes for students taking courses on this TOP code compare to potentially similar programs at colleges in the state and region, as well as to outcomes across all CTE programs at City College of San Francisco and in the region.

This report profiles Education Pathways Occupations in the 12 county Bay Region and in the Mid-Peninsula Sub-Region for Program Recommendation City College of San Francisco.

Educational Supply

There are four community colleges in the Bay Region issuing 20 awards on average annually (last 3 years ending 2021-23) on TOP 1305.50 - The School Age Child. In the Mid-Peninsula Sub-Region, there is one community college that issued 8 awards on average annually (last 3 years) on this TOP code.

There is one four-year institution in the Bay Region issuing 4 bachelor's degrees on average annually (last 3 years ending 2020-22) on CIP 13.1202- Elementary Education and Teaching. There are no four-year institutions in the Mid-Peninsula Sub-Region issuing bachelor's degrees on this CIP code.
