

Labor Market Analysis for Program Recommendation Medical Assisting Occupations East Bay Subregion

Prepared by the Bay Region Center of Excellence for Labor Market Research

September 2025

Recommendation

Based on all available data, there appears to be an "undersupply" of Medical Assisting workers compared to the demand for this cluster of occupations in the Bay Region and in the East Bay Subregion (Alameda, Contra Costa counties). There is a projected annual gap of about 39,675 students in the Bay Region and 11,703 students in the East Bay Subregion.

Introduction

This report provides student outcomes data on employment and earnings for TOP 1208.00 - Medical Assisting programs in the state and region. It is recommended that these data be reviewed to better understand how outcomes for students taking courses on this TOP code compare to potentially similar programs at Subregion in the state and region.

This report includes middle-skill occupations that require a certificate, or an associate degree, or it may require a bachelor's degree, but 33% or fewer of current workers in these roles hold one. This report profiles Medical Assisting Occupations in the 12 county Bay Region and in the East Bay Subregion.

• Community Health Workers (21-1094): Promote health within a community by assisting individuals to adopt healthy behaviors. Serve as an advocate for the health needs of individuals by assisting community residents in effectively communicating with healthcare providers or social service agencies. Act as liaison or advocate and implement programs that promote, maintain, and improve individual and overall community health. May deliver health-related preventive services such as blood pressure, glaucoma, and hearing screenings. May collect data to help identify community health needs.

• Health Information Technologists and Medical Registrars (29-9021): Apply knowledge of healthcare and information systems to assist in the design, development, and continued modification and analysis of computerized healthcare systems. Abstract, collect, and analyze treatment and follow up information of patients. May educate staff and assist in problem solving to promote the implementation of the healthcare information system. May design, develop, test, and implement databases with complete history, diagnosis, treatment, and health status to help monitor diseases.

• Home Health and Personal Care Aides (31-1128): Assist individuals with disabilities or illness by providing personal care and support with activities of daily living, such as feeding, bathing, dressing, grooming, toileting, and ambulation. They may also help with routine healthcare tasks, including changing bandages, dressing wounds, or administering medication, typically under the direction of licensed nursing staff who are offsite or intermittently onsite. In addition, aides often support household needs such as preparing meals, light housekeeping, and laundry, depending on the patient's abilities. Work is carried out in a variety of settings, including the individual's home, workplace, community, or daytime nonresidential facilities.

Educational Supply

There are eleven community colleges in the Bay Region issuing 265 awards on average annually (last 3 years ending 2023-24) on TOP 1208.00 - Medical Assisting. In the East Bay Subregion, there is two community colleges that issued 39 awards on average annually (last 3 years) on this TOP code.

There are sixteen other CTE educational institutions in the Bay Region issuing 1,872 awards on average annually (last 3 years ending 2022-23) on CIP 51.0801- Medical/Clinical Assistant. There are five other CTE educational institutions in the East Bay Subregion issuing 1,111 awards on average annually (last 3 years) on this CIP code.

Gap Analysis

Based on the data included in this report, there is a labor market gap in the Bay Region with 41,812 annual openings for the Medical Assisting occupational cluster and 2,137 annual (3-year average) awards for an annual undersupply of 39,675 students. In the East Bay Subregion, there is also a gap with 12,853 annual openings and 1,150 annual (3-year average) awards for an annual undersupply of 11,703 students.
