

# Labor Market Analysis for Program Recommendation Barbering Occupations North Bay Subregion

Prepared by the Bay Region Center of Excellence for Labor Market Research

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### Recommendation

Based on all available data, there appears to be an "oversupply" of Barbering workers compared to the demand for this cluster of occupations in the Bay Region and no gap in the North Bay subregion (Marin, Napa, Solano, Sonoma counties). There is a projected oversupply of about 339 students in the Bay Region and no gap in the North Bay subregion.

### Introduction

This report provides student outcomes data on employment and earnings for TOP 3007.00 - Cosmetology and Barbering programs in the state and region. It is recommended that these data be reviewed to better understand how outcomes for students taking courses on this TOP code compare to potentially similar programs at subregion in the state and region. This report includes a middle-skill occupation that requires a certificate, or an associate degree, or it may require a bachelor's degree, but 33% or fewer of current workers in these roles hold one.

This report profiles Barbering Occupations in the 12 county Bay Region and in the North Bay subregion.

• **Barbers (39-5011):** Provide barbering services, such as cutting, trimming, shampooing, and styling hair; trimming beards; or giving shaves.

## **Educational Supply**

There are six community colleges in the Bay Region issuing 312 awards on average annually (last 3 years ending 2023-24) on TOP 3007.00 - Cosmetology and Barbering. In the North Bay subregion, there is one community college that issued 15 awards on average annually (last 3 years) on this TOP code.

There are eight other CTE educational institutions in the Bay Region issuing 253 awards on average annually (last 3 years ending 2022-23) on CIP 12.0402- Barbering/Barber. There are two other CTE educational institutions in the North Bay subregion issuing 27 awards on average annually (last 3 years) on this CIP code.

## **Gap Analysis**

Based on the data included in this report, there is a labor market gap in the Bay Region with 226 annual openings for the Barbering occupational cluster and 565 annual (3-year average) awards for an annual oversupply of 339 students. In the North Bay subregion, there is no gap with 42 annual openings and 42 annual (3-year average) awards.
