Report Highlights



Top Jobs and Equity Assessment + Strategies to Close Equity Gaps

The SCC COE identified 37 Top Jobs and equity gaps within those jobs, showing that while people of color are well represented in community college programs, they are significantly underrepresented in Top Jobs. To address this challenge, the SCC COE identified barriers to closing gaps and potential strategies to close these gaps.





South Central Coast Community College Apprenticeship Opportunities: **Expanding Workforce Pathways**

The SCC COE found there are just over 4,500 apprentices in the region. Additionally, community colleges in the SCC Region offer three active apprenticeship programs, five courses, and have received \$2.5 million in California Apprenticeship Initiative (CAI) funding.





South Central Coast Labor Market Landscape

The SCC COE classified nearly 800 occupations into High-, Medium-, and Low-Quality categories. The 155 High-Quality occupations are concentrated in Health Business and Entrepreneurship, and Education and Human Development. High quality occupations accounted for 27% of total regional employment in 2024 (273,291 jobs).





High-Quality Occupations County Profiles

The SCC COE expanded on the South Central Coast Labor Market Landscape by identifying High-Ouality occupations in each SCC County. Across all counties, Health, Business and Entrepreneurship, and Education and Human Development sectors had the most High-Quality occupations.


2025 LMI Overview

LMI Request Synopsis

The SCC COE received **87 requests** for data from regional community colleges. **Allan Hancock College submitted the most requests**, accounting for 22% of requests received, **closely followed by Moorpark College** and **Oxnard College** (21% each)

SCC Community Colleges requested data in high-wage, high-demand sectors, with the most requests in ICT/Digital Media (23%), followed by Health (15), and Energy, Construction, and Utilities (9%). ICT/Digital Media has relatively low demand (2,758 openings), but the highest wages (\$38/hr.). Health has high demand (17,676 openings) and the third-highest wages (\$30/hr.), while Energy, Construction and Utilities has medium-demand (7,212) and the fourth-highest wages (\$26/hr.).

Most LMI requests were for Program Review (38%) or New Programs (35%). Noncredit Vocational Programs accounted for the fewest requests (3%).
